

FROM I-75 NORTH


- Take exit 354

HORSE SHOW RULES

Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current federation rule book and current FEI rules will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

2025 USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of competitions listed herein. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors, and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

If not currently a USEF Active Competing member or Subscriber, I acknowledge that I will be enrolled for no cost as a USEF Fan and my USEF Fan Account will continue to annually automatically renew in the USEF's sole discretion. Additionally, I acknowledge that the benefits of a USEF Fan are subject to change without notice. USEF may in its sole discretion, at any time, terminate my USEF Fan status. I acknowledge that I may opt out at any time by going to My USEF Dashboard or calling (859)810-8733.

HORSE SHOW RULES

STATEMENT AS TO FEDERATION FEE

(GR407.1-3) For every horse participating in any competition licensed by the Federation, a \$23 Federation Fee will be collected (\$15 shall be an Equine Drugs & Medication Fee to provide for research, inspection, and enforcement of rules regarding used of medications and drugs & \$8 USEF Fee). Each horse entered will also be required to pay a \$10 USHJA Fee and a USHJA Showpass \$30 fee will be collected for any person who is not a current USHJA member. USEF Membership is required.

The Horse Show Management reserves the right in itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of an incident without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show management, their decision to be final.

The Horse Show Management reserves the right to limit entries, refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without claim for damages; to change any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings, or judges; to change specifications in jumper classes in order to facilitate the time schedule or as competition warrants, or to make any changes management deems is in the best interest of the show and its exhibitors.

Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show, its members, directors and employees, contractors, sponsoring entities and facility harmless for any loss or accident to horse, horses or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

SAFE SPORT STATEMENT

Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All Participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

NECROPSY

I understand that any horse/pony "fatality" defined as a death by any means including euthanasia, at any time from when entries arrive at the Venue until departure from the Venue, or a death by any means including euthanasia at any time occurring as a result of any fatal injury or illness sustained during any WEC Event shall result in a necropsy. For any necropsy the Owner of the horse/pony shall perform a gross mortem examination, and the Owner hereby agrees to share all findings, results and medical reports with WEC. In the event an Owner does not perform a gross post-mortem examination of the horse/pony, the Owner hereby authorized WEC to perform the gross postmortem examination at its sole cost and expense and agrees to share the results with Owner.

In the event an Owner's horse/pony dies from a disease that affects (an) other horse(s)/pony(ies) at the Venue the Owner of the deceased horse/pony agrees to indemnify any other third party Owner of a horse/pony affected and further agrees to indemnify and hold WEC harmless from any claim, demand, or liability arising out of or in any way related to the deceased horse/pony.

CONDITIONS

Office Hours: Office opens Wednesday-Sunday 1 hour before showing. Office closes at 5pm daily or 30 minutes after the last class finishes, whichever comes first. Adds for the next day must be completed by 4pm.

Important USEF rules in effect: As of January 1, 2019, every USEF adult member (18 years of age or older) with a Competing Membership must complete USEF's Safe Sport Training. You will do this when logged into your USEF account, preferably when you renew your membership. Failure to complete the Safe Sport training will disqualify you from competing in any capacity until it is completed. Junior riders that have reached their 18th birthday must complete Safe Sport training.

Photography: Andrew Ryback Photography is the official photographer of the 2025 Fall Series at World Equestrian Center - Ocala. By entering the premises of World Equestrian Center (WEC), you enter an area where photography, audio and video recording may occur. By entering the property, you consent to photography, audio and/or video recording, and the release, publication, exhibition or reproduction to be used for news, web, social media, advertising and other promotional purposes by WEC and its affiliates and representatives. In entering the WEC grounds, you release WEC, its officers and employees, and each and all persons involved from any liability connected with the taking, recording, digitizing, or publication and use of interviews, photographs, images, video and/or audio recordings. All rights to royalties, claims of payment in connection with any use of media materials listed above, are waived, regardless of whether a fee or admission is charged or sponsorship applied. You have been fully informed of your, consent, waiver of liability, and release before entering WEC grounds.

Mandatory Microchipping: As of December 1st, 2025, ALL horses must be microchipped. You will not be allowed to compete with any horse that has not been microchipped. The microchip must be uploaded to your USEF account. All horses that require a USHJA Registration will also require a microchip.

Stabling: All stalls (12'x12' and 12'x14') are permanent concrete stalls with doors, stable comfort mattress systems, and fans. Stalls may not be occupied by more than one horse at a time. A \$25 manure removal fee will be applied per stall. However, this fee will be waived if you purchase a minimum of three bags of shavings per stall from the WEC Ocala Feed and Bedding Store.

Weekly Stall/Paddock Reservations: Stalls/paddocks are property of World Equestrian Center. Stalls are \$300/week and must be secured with a form of payment (credit card or check) in the Horse Show Office. Locking tack rooms are \$325. Stalls and Paddocks can be reserved at [HorseShowing.com](https://www.horsheshowing.com). No reservations will be accepted through email. Reservations will be complete upon processing of payment and approval of World Equestrian Center. Paddocks are \$375/week and subject to availability and stall count. No reservations will be accepted through email. Please understand that we are unable to accept location requests at this time. Tack stall and paddock requests will be accommodated based on the ratio of horse stalls ordered. Weekly stalls can be canceled up to 21 days before the start of the horse show. No cancellations will be accepted after unless a veterinary letter is provided.

Horses are not allowed in locking tack rooms. A \$50 cleaning fee per stall and/or tack room will occur for any left behind personal belongings and trash. Shavings are to be purchased on-site. Any off-site shavings will result in an additional \$25 manure disposal fee per stall. A \$100 fee per stall and/or tack room will occur for any nails or screws in stalls/tack rooms. A \$50 charge for cardboard shavings.

Paddock Restrictions: Horses may not be turned out in paddocks between dusk and dawn.

Feed and Bedding: must be ordered through <https://worldequestriancenter.jotform.com/form/223222771406146> at least 24 hours in advance to guarantee delivery prior to arrival. No outside shavings deliveries permitted.

Trainer Splits: Weekly tack stalls/grooming stalls, feed & bedding can now be split in the Horse Show Office. Splits have to be done each week by Friday at 4pm! If not done by Friday, the trainer will be responsible for the entire invoice. Any Feed/Bedding orders made after 2pm Friday will have to be paid for in full at the time of ordering.

Ship In Fee: \$150/week. Park in designated area only. All horses must be entered in the show and be issued a WEC back number. Any horse not paying the horse show for a stall will be charged a ship in fee.

CONDITIONS

Entry Closing: Online entries must be submitted two weeks prior to the start of the competition week. Submit online entries through [HorseShowing.com](https://www.horshewing.com). All horses must have a WEC issued back number to be worn at all times that the horse is actively working. Late fee is \$50 after the closing date for online entries. Late fee starting Tuesday of the show week is \$100.

Checking In and Checking Out: All horses must leave a check or credit card on file. All accounts must be settled every week, in full, upon the conclusion of the final class on Sunday. Those that do not check out or leave an open check with the office will be charged a \$50 late check out fee for each day past Sunday.

Email ocalacheckout@wec.net to request a link to pay your bill online. Include horse name/back number in email.

All Horses on Property: All horses on the grounds are required to have an entry form submitted before arrival, and must wear the issued back number from the Horse Show Office at all times when out of the stall or trailer. Any horse discovered on the grounds without a completed entry will be subject to a \$500 penalty in addition to regular fees for a non showing or showing horse.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION CONCERNING SPLITTING/COMBINING \$ ADD/SCRATCH POLICY IN ALL "A" RATED HUNTER SECTIONS: Should entries warrant, all "A" rated hunter sections will be split or combined following USEF rules and will be done so at the close of the horse show office on the evening preceding the first class in each section, therefore entries MUST be completed for "A" rated hunter divisions accordingly to be considered. Any post-adds received and accepted after this time will not be considered in respect to the splitting/combining numbers. There will be no exceptions to this policy. Same day scratches and/or "no-shows" at the gate in all "a" rated hunter sections will forfeit their entry fee unless a Vet Scratch Certificate from the official horse show veterinarian is received prior to the first class of the section in question. Should same day scratches or no-shows result in insufficient entries to keep sections split, sections will be combined.

Adding Classes: Can be done directly through [HorseShowing.com](https://www.horshewing.com) or in Horse Show Office until 4pm the day before the class is scheduled. Please be sure to enter classes in a timely manner. Scheduling cannot accommodate same day adds. In the event an add after 5pm the day prior is approved by management, a \$25 late add fee will incur.

*****RDNE (Rode Did Not Enter):** Entries that show in a class that were not properly entered either online, by inclusion on your original entry form, or a properly filled out add slip/online add PRIOR to the class involved will be charged a \$50 RDNE Fee.

Scratching Classes: Scratches can be done directly in your [HorseShowing.com](https://www.horshewing.com) account any time until the start of the class except "A" rated hunters cannot scratch same day. Informing the starter that you do not intend to participate WILL NOT scratch the class. A horse on the grounds scratching all classes will become a non-showing horse regardless of the reason and will incur all fees associated with a non-showing horse. After showing in the first class of any "A" rated section requiring a section entry fee, no refunds will be given for scratching any classes within the section for any reason.

Non-Showing Horses: All horses on the grounds are required to have a signed entry form in the office, whether they are showing or not. This entry form must include signatures and a complete description of the horse.

Payment Method: Show Fees may be paid by cash, check drawn on an American bank, or any major credit card (3% fee).

Returned Checks/Declined Credit Cards/Credit Card Chargebacks: Checks returned by the bank, declined credit cards or chargebacks on credit card transactions for any reason are regarded as a serious offense and will be handled as follows: A 10% penalty will be assessed for every returned check or credit card chargeback (minimum of \$50). Accounts will be given ten days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be reported to USEF for collection/disciplinary action.

CONDITIONS

Prize Money/Awards: An IRS W9 needs to be completed showing the proper prize money recipient and their SS or Fed ID #. Care must be taken to be sure the information matches that of the IRS. Prize money will be deducted from your account upon closeout in the office provided you have submitted the required W9 or W8 for Foreign exhibitors. Balances will be paid by check and mailed to the named recipient on the W9 within 30 days after the conclusion of the show. The IRS W9 form is available in the show office/through HorseShowing.com account. All Hunter purses shall be divided as follows unless otherwise specified: 1st-30%, 2nd-22%, 3rd-15%, 4th-12%, 5th-11%, 6th-10%. All Hunter Classic purses shall be divided as follows unless otherwise specified: 1st-25%, 2nd-19%, 3rd-15%, 4th-10%, 5th-9%, 6th-8%, 7th-7%, 8th-7%. Ribbons will be awarded to eighth place in all hunter classes. Total hunter prize money offered for National weeks: \$87,490. \$24,999 in hunter prize money is guaranteed to be paid out each week.

Awards Ceremonies: Riders are required to ride for awards in all Classics/Grand Prix, unless notice of ceremony cancellation has been given. Failure of a rider to be present may result in forfeiture of all prizes won in the class. Competition management reserves the right to require participation in any tie-breaking procedure (if required) may include, but is not limited to; forfeiture of prize money and/or elimination from the competition. The decision of management is final.

Refunds: Entries canceled prior to the closing date will be refunded in full. Stalls and processing fee are not refundable for any reason after the closing date. All scratches must be submitted in writing to be considered for a refund. All accounts become final after the close of the show, changes will not be considered after this date, no exceptions. Please look over your statement carefully before checking out. If the show must be stopped due to a storm, accident, or other emergency, the show management has the right to deny a refund of any or all fees. Refunds will be issued at the end of the series.

Processing/EMT/Night Watch: Each horse will pay a \$130 per show Processing Fee. The Processing Fee is a non-refundable fee which will also entitle each horse to properly add/scratch regular classes at no additional cost.

Arrival and Departure: Horses may arrive after 3pm on Monday and depart no later than 7am Monday. Early arrival and late departure must be arranged directly with the stabling manager. Early arrivals and late departures will incur an \$50 per stall/per day fee.

Health Requirements:

1. 30-Day Statement of Health: A valid certificate of veterinary inspection is required for all out-of-state horses.
2. Negative Coggins: Required within 12 months of arrival.

3. Trainer/Owner Health Declaration: Signed confirmation that the horse has not shown signs of illness in the last 28 days; any infectious disease within the past six months must be disclosed.

4. At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below.
 - a. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.
 - b. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.
 - c. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine, and date of vaccine administration.
 - d. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.
 - e. Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee.

To streamline the verification and tracking of horse health records, WEC – Ocala is partnering with EquiTrace® EventPass, the official verified Horse Health Records provider of US Equestrian (USEF). See page 14 for details.

Courtesy Circle: In some instances it may become necessary to restrict the area of the courtesy circle by a mandatory line. If implemented, it will be clearly marked on the course chart and a corresponding barrier will be erected on the course. A public announcement will also be made.

CONDITIONS

Dogs - Leash Law: Dogs and other pets must be on a leash at all times while on the show grounds. Fines for dogs found without a leash will result in a \$100 fine. No dog pens are allowed outside of the barns or in shared aisles. No dogs in stalls overnight.

Motorized Vehicles: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competition. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hoverboards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Parking Violations: Fines of up to \$100 may be assessed, and vehicles may be booted. All fines can be paid at the Horse Show Office.

Medical Waste: Sharps must be placed in proper receptacles located in each barn. Failure to do this will result in a \$100 fine or other penalties deemed necessary by the Show Management.

Protective Headgear: It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian used and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent, guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards and is properly fitted and in good condition.

Poling: Manual poling and the use of bamboo offsets are prohibited at all times on the grounds of the World Equestrian Center. In the event of a violation of this rule, the involved horse and its trainer of record as indicated on the entry form will be suspended from further competition at the show in which the violation occurred. In addition, no refunds will be given for any unused fees.

Emergency Information: All Horses must have an emergency information card attached to their stall.

Horse Show Championships: In all Hunter Championships, the titles shall be awarded to two of the four horses which have acquired the most points over fences. In addition to these points, only these four horses shall receive full points for ribbons won in the Under Saddle classes and half points for ribbons won in Model. Points awarded for all divisions as follows: 10-6-4-2-1-1/2 except Jumper bonus classes. Ties in USEF Hunter Championships shall be decided as specified in the USEF Rule Book. Others shall remain tied and shall flip/draw for the awards. Ties in Jumper divisions to be decided by the bonus class placing, if still tied they shall remain tied and entries shall flip/draw for the awards.

Course diagrams will be posted no later than 30 minutes before the class. In some cases, the area of the courtesy circle may be restricted by a dotted line. Under Saddle classes to be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. No martingales permitted. In High Performance, A/O and Junior classes, entries may be asked to hand gallop collectively one way of the ring, at the Judge's discretion. No more than eight shall be asked to hand gallop at one time. Minimum entry requirements: Management reserves the right to combine Sections with less than six entries. No split Section will be held with less than four entries. Handy Hunter Courses and jumps to simulate those found in trappy hunt country, and may include natural obstacles, a trot fence and a fence to lead over. Jogging - The traditional manner of jogging for soundness in hunter classes is waived, and horses and ponies will job for soundness under saddle by trotting a circle on a loose rein at the end of each over-fences performance.

- Management may offer multiple height options if stated in the prize list, but each course must be set at the same height throughout.
- Course design must comply with EQ108 and 109, except combination is required.

Spread not to exceed fence height

Combining/Dividing Sections:

Age-Group Equitation Sections may be combined as necessary, jumping at their respective heights, to meet the three (3) entry minimum requirement for points to be awarded. Stallions are prohibited when adult equitation sections are combined with children's/junior equitation sections. EQ101.3.

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and _____ ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

WARNING:

Under Florida law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities.

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events. 



Monitor your horse for clinical signs of disease & report a temperature over 101.5°F to a veterinarian.




