


#### CLOSING DATES

Stall counts must be finalized by Tuesday 14 days prior to the show. Tack stalls do not need to be prepaid. After the closing date stalls are not refundable and there is no guarantee we will be able to accommodate additional reservations. All stabling communications must be done through stalls@wec.net.

Complete your entries online at: HorseShowing.com If you are mailing an entry it must be received no later than 14 days before the show to avoid late fee. Online entries must be submitted by the Friday before the show to avoid late fees. There is no penalty for adding classes or changing horses (same owner) at the show. #### 2025 USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Federation Entry Agreement: I have read the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") Entry Agreement (GR906.4) as printed in the Prize List for World Equestrian Center/Arena Horse Shows ("Competition") and agree to all of its provisions. I understand and agree that by entering this Competition, I am subject to Federation Rules, the Prize List, and local rules of the competition. I agree to waive the right to the use of my photos from the competition, and agree that any actions against the Federation must be brought in New York State. The complete statement is as follows: FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable-casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4

#### STATEMENT AS TO FEDERATION FEE

(GR407.1-3) For every horse participating in any competition licensed by the Federation, a \$23 Federation Fee will be collected (\$15 shall be an Equine Drugs & Medication Fee to provide for research, inspection and enforcement of rules regarding use of medications and drugs).

The Horse Show Management reserves the right in itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of an incident without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management, their decision to be final.

The Horse Show Management reserves the right to limit entries, refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without claim for damages; to change any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or judges; to change specifications in jumper classes in order to facilitate the time schedule or as competition warrants, or make any changes management deems is in the best interest of the show and its exhibitors.

Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show, its members, directors and employees, contractors, sponsoring entities and facility harmless for any loss or accident to horse, horses or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

#### **EVERYTHING YOU NEED TO KNOW**

SHOW PASS FEE: Effective 12-1-2022 any rider, handler, driver, or owner are limited to one Show Pass purchase annually (December 1-November 30). USEF Show Pass will be available for purchase by exhibitors online only. USEF Membership will be required in order to compete (named on an entry form as owner, rider, trainer, or coach) for anyone who has not purchased a show pass at USEF.org.

Under Saddle and Flat classes will not be held up for trainer conflicts. It is the riders responsibility to be at the ring when the class is opened. Management and staff will not be responsible for missed flat classes.

All horses on the grounds MUST have an entry form submitted BEFORE arrival. Any horse discovered on the grounds without an entry will pay a \$500 penalty over and above all the regular fees for a non showing or showing horse. This is to protect everyone as all horses must show appropriate health papers upon arrival.

All horses competing must have a USEF identification number.

Assigned back numbers are required in all exercise, schooling and lunging areas.

Air vests are allowed (and encouraged) in all disciplines. For hunter and equitation classes, judges are instructed to not deduct points for the use of an air vest. Please understand that the show will not be delayed in order to reset the air vest. Riders who choose to wear air vests are therefore strongly encouraged to have spare equipment (air canisters, tethers, and entire vest) ringside so that the vests that have been inflated can quickly be returned to operation. Air vests are permitted without a show coat ONLY if being worn with a color matched. Jong sleeve, collared shirt.

Office Hours – 5pm daily OR 30 minutes after the last class finishes, whichever comes FIRST. Adds for the next day must be completed before the office closes. The online add feature is automatically disabled for next day classes at 5pm. Scratches can be completed online up until the results are posted for the class. Any class not scratched properly in the office or online will be billed.

Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

As of Jan 1, 2019 every USEF adult member (18 years of age or older) must complete USEF's Safe Sport Training. You will do this when logged into your USEF account, preferably when you renew your membership. Failure to complete the safe sport training will disqualify you from competing in any capacity until it is completed. Don't get caught on the suspended list! Do it today!! Junior riders that have reached their 18th Birthday must complete safe sport.

Mandatory Microchipping went into effect on December 1, 2018. You will not be allowed to COMPETE any horse that has not been microchipped and the microchip must be uploaded to their USEF account. All horses that require a USHJA Registration will also require a microchip. Do it today!!

**Stabling:** Stalls are permanent wood construction with dutch doors for outside air and rubber mats, 10x12 with doors; some may be 10x10 with doors. When submitting your reservation please put in the NOTES portion any special needs you may have.

Aisles: Aisles must be kept clear, please purchase a tack stall to store tack trunks, hay, feed, Theraplates, etc. No Cross ties in aisles at any time. No loitering will be permitted in barn aisles. No tacking or grooming in aisles. No horses or dogs are permitted to be tied in the aisles. Dogs on leashes must not be able to access the aisle unless attached to a human as it is dangerous for horses and people passing by.

Stall Reservations: Stalls for horses will be \$250 and must be secured with your reservation with payment in full, open check or credit card. The cancelation deadline is the Tuesday 14 days before the start of the competition, after that stalls will not be refunded for any reason. If not prepaid then the credit card or open check on file will be executed. Any stall occupied by anything other than a horse will be billed at \$250 (considered a tack stall), and do not need to be prepaid. Horse stalls and tack Stalls must be ordered on HorseShowing.com, you will need to have a free account. Be sure to use the STALLS/FEED AND BEDDING option, this feature will be turned off when the available supply is exhausted. Stalls are not available on entries but should you have a confirmed stall you can pay a \$250 ENTRY DEPOSIT online at time of entry submission in lieu of sending an open check. We require a minimum of one tack stall if you have three or more horses.

Earbuds or earphones are prohibited in any areas designated for schooling and exercise including lunging areas.

Processing/EMT/Night Watch/Schooling Fee: Will be shown on your invoice as ADMIN fee and covers Office, EMT, Schooling and Night Watch Fee. \$145. \$55 of this fee is non-refundable in the case of a scratched entry.

Feed and Bedding – Should be ordered online by Friday prior to your arrival to guarantee they will be delivered prior to your arrival. Once stalls are occupied it may not be possible to get in front of your stalls and orders will be left outside the door. You can order additional product at any time using your horseshowing.com account. Slips are also available in the show office. No outside deliveries are permitted for hay, feed or bedding. A \$20 fee per stall will be assessed to those bringing in outside shaving. Once an order has been delivered, we do not accept returns. In certain cases, a restocking fee will apply to items returned at managements discretion.

Grounds Fee: All horses must purchase a stall, we do not have accommodations for showing out of trailers.

Entry Closing: The entry closing date for mailed entries is received 14 days before the first day of the show, or the Friday before the show for onlineentries submitted at www.HorseShowing.com. Entries must be received by this date to be considered on time. Late fee is \$50 after the closing date and \$75 if received after noon the day before the show starts.

Foreign Checks: All foreign exhibitors must pay by credit card, cash or a check drawn on a US Bank.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION CONCERNING SPLITTING/COMBINING & ADD/SCRATCH POLICY IN ALL "A" RATED HUNTER SECTIONS that require a section fee—Should entries warrant, all "A" rated hunter sections will be split or combined following USEF rules and will be done so at the close of the horse show office on the evening preceding the first class is each section, therefore entries MUST be completed for "A" rated hunter divisions accordingly to be considered. Any post-adds received and accepted after this time will not be considered in respect to the splitting/combining numbers. There will be no exceptions to this policy. Same day scratches and/or "no-shows" at the gate in all "A" rated hunter sections will forfeit their entry fee. Should same day scratches or no-shows result in insufficient entries to keep sections split, sections will be combined.

Adding Classes: This must be done through your HorseShowing.com account or on a trainer report in the show office by 5pm the night before the class. Same day adds may be denied. All adds must be done online or through the horse show office. You may not add at the gate.

Scratching Classes: If done through your HorseShowing.com account it will immediately remove the class from your bill AND it will immediately send a message to the starter and the announcer that you are scratched. If you only tell the gate you are scratching the fee WILL NOT come off your bill, they do not have ability to scratch you from a class. "A" rated hunter classes requiring a section fee cannot be scratched same day. Horses on the grounds scratching all classes will become a non-showing horse regardless of the reason and will incur all fees associated with a non-showing horse. After showing in the first class of any "A" rated section requiring a section entry fee, no refunds will be given for scratching any classes within the section for any reason. All scratches must be done online or in the horse show office/ All scratches must be done before results are posted for the class.

Non-Showing Horses: All horses on the grounds are required to have a signed entry form in the office, whether they are showing or not. This entry form must include signatures and a complete description of the horse. Non-Showing horses will pay a fee of \$150 per show plus admin fees. Competing in 3 classes, or at least \$150 in entry fees will be considered a showing horses. Scratched horses on the grounds are considered non-showing horses regardless of the reason.

Prize Money/Awards: The proper taxpayer MUST be declared every week no later than the close of business on Saturday, prize money is withheld until this is declared. An IRS/W9 needs to be completed showing the proper prize money recipient and their SS or FED ID#. Care must be taken to be sure the information matches that of the IRS. Prize money will be deducted from your account upon closeout in the office provided you have submitted the required W9 or W8 for Foreign exhibitors no later than Saturday. We cannot take the necessary time to verify your W9 against IRS records on Sunday, therefore you will need to pay your bill in full and a check will be mailed after the W9 has passed the IRS checker. Balances will be paid in the form of a check mailed to the named recipient on the W9 within 30 days after the conclusion of the show. The IRS W9 form is available in the show office. Prize money will not be paid in any classes that are run with less than 3 entries or the minimum required entries, if held they will become schooling classes. Ribbons to a minimum of 8 places will be given in all hunter, jumper and equitation classes.

#### Check Out: Check Out is EASY at WEC

- 1. You can print your statement at the exhibitors terminal and drop your check in the box on the counter.
- 2. You can check out directly on the exhibitors terminal with a credit card.
- 3. You can TEXT Julie at 248-892-6806 with your back number and request an emailed statement that will have a direct PAY HERE link.
- 4. You can check out directly with us at the counter.
- 5. Regardless of how you do it, you MUST settle your account at the end of each week. If you want us to check you out after you are done showing you MUST pre-arrange that. Be sure to check your statement carefully before checking out, they become final at the conclusion of the show. Failure to check out will cause a \$50 per day per entry penalty starting at midnight Sunday night.

Payment Method – Show Fees/bedding/feed may be paid by cash, check drawn on an American bank, or any major credit card (@3% fee).

Returned Checks/Credit card chargebacks: Checks returned by the bank, declined credit cards, or chargebacks on credit card transactions for any reason are regarded as a most serious offense and will be handled as follows: A 10% Penalty will be assessed for every returned check or credit card chargeback (Minimum of \$50). Accounts will be given ten days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be reported to USEF for collection/disciplinary action. Accounts may also be turned in to the County Attorney's Office for filing of criminal charges.

### All purses shall be divided as follows unless otherwise specified: 1st-30% / 2nd-22% / 3rd-15% / 4th-12% / 5th-11% / 6th-10%.

**Refunds:** Entries canceled prior to the closing date will be refunded in full. Stalls and processing fee are not refundable for any reason after the closing date of entries. All entry scratches must be submitted in writing (stalls@wec.net) to be considered for a refund. All accounts become final after the close of the show, changes will not be considered after this date, no exceptions! Please look over your statement carefully before checking out. If the show must be stopped due to a storm, accident, or other emergency, the show management has the right to deny a refund of any or all fees.

Arrival and Departure: Horses may arrive after 3pm on Monday and depart no later than 7am Monday. Early arrival and late departure must be arranged directly with the stabling manager. \$40 per day fee will apply for those that have permission to arrive early. Your stall location might be in a different area until your assigned stalls are available. Any stalls not vacated by 7am on Monday will be billed at a rate of \$50 per hour for every hour past 7am. No exceptions. If you have an emergency of any kind that delays your departure you will likely have to move horses to an outer barn.

**Health Requirements:** All horses entering the World Equestrian Center grounds must have valid proof of negative coggins test (within 12 months) and Proof of mandatory vaccinations is required per USEF rules. A 30 day certificate of veterinary inspection is required for all horses arriving from outside the state of Ohio. Horses who fail to arrive with appropriate paperwork will not be allowed to unload on show grounds. Documents should be emailed to ohhealth@wec.net.

Rings: Main Hunter outside is 280' X 152', Hunter 2 outside is 280' X 150', Jumper Ring outside is 300' X 250", Roberts is 110' x 266', R & L Ring is 130' x 300', , R & L Annex Ring is 130' x 300' Sanctuary 170 X 325. GGT Mix.

**Lunging:** We have a 130'  $\times$  270' outdoor ring across from barn A, 55'  $\times$  145' indoor for lunging adjacent to the Roberts Ring, and 220'  $\times$  315" outdoor ring behind the cabins. No lunging in show rings. All lunging arenas are GGT-Footing.

**Courtesy Circle:** In some instances it may become necessary to restrict the area of the courtesy circle by a mandatory line. If this is implemented it will be clearly marked on the course chart and a corresponding barrier will be erected on the course. A public announcement will also be made.

Motorized Vehicles: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters

is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

**Paddocks:** Paddocks are available for rent on a daily or weekly basis. Paddocks are to be reserved on horseshowing.com. Weekly paddocks become available Monday at 3pm. Daily paddocks are available daily from 8am to dusk. **No overnight turn out permitted.** ONE horse/pony per paddock.

**Dogs** - **Leash Law:** Dogs and other pets must be on a leash at all times while on the show grounds. Please do not tie dogs in aisles.

RDNE (Rode Did Not Enter): Entries that show in a class that was not properly entered either online, by inclusion on your original entry, or a properly filled out add slip PRIOR to the class involved will be charged a \$25 RDNE Fee, and you will not be considered for an award in that class. This charge will show on your statement as "entered off judge's card". All adds must be completed by 5:00 P.M. the day before the class in question to assure acceptance.

**Medical Waste:** Sharps must be placed in proper receptacles located in each barn. Failure to do this will result in a \$100 fine or other penalties deemed necessary by the show management.

Protective Headgear It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent, guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards and is properly fitted and in good condition.

**Poling:** Manual poling and the use of bamboo offsets are prohibited at all times on the grounds of the World Equestrian Center. In the event of a violation of this rule, the involved horse and its trainer of record as indicated on the entry form will be suspended from further competition at the show in which the violation occurred. In addition, no refunds will be given for any unused fees.

**Emergency Information:** All horses must have an emergency information card attached to their stall for contact purposes. Please be sure to fill one out and attach it to your stall.

Horse Show Championships: In all Hunter Championships, the titles shall be awarded to two of the four horses which have acquired the most points over fences. In addition to these points, only these four horses shall receive full points for ribbons won in Under Saddle classes and half points for ribbons won in Model. Equitation Championships shall be equal points with ties broken by points over fences. Points awarded for all divisions as follows: 10-6-4-2-1-1/2 except Jumper bonus classes. Ties in USEF Hunter Championships shall be decided as specified in the USEF Rule Book. Others shall remain tied and shall flip/draw for the awards. Ties in Jumper divisions to be decided by the bonus class placing, if still tied they shall remain tied and entries shall flip/draw for the awards.

Campers: Camper spaces are available for \$300. Reservations should be done on horseshowing.com. Full hook-ups are available on a first come-first serve basis. Camper sights are available starting Monday at 3pm and must be vacated by the following Monday at 7am. Storage of campers on WEC property is strictly prohibited. Any camper left on WEC grounds will be subject to a storage fee of \$50 per week provided they have general manager permission, otherwise they will be towed at owners expense. All campers must be declared at arrival or by Wednesday in the horse show office. If a camper is found to be undeclared, you will be subject to a \$500 penalty.

# 2025 World Equestrian Center Ohio Young Horse Hunter and Jumper Incentive Programs

## WEC Ohio if offering an affordable way to bring along your young horses at a premier facility.

All nominated <u>jumpers</u> will be eligible for the \$45,000 Young Jumper Championship. Jumpers will pay a one-time nomination fee to enter the program. Entry fees and jumper nomination fees will be FREE for every show through November 2025.

Entry Fee: \$300 - 25%, 19%, 15%, 10%, 9%, 8%, 7%, 7%

3001. \$15,000 WEC 6-year-old

Entry Fee: \$500 - 30%, 22%, 13%, 8%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 3%, 3%, 2%, 2%, 2%

All nominated <u>hunters</u> will be eligible for the Young Hunter Championship, where they will be offered back 100% of the nomination fees collected throughout the year as prize money (with a minimum of \$2,500 guaranteed). Hunters will pay a one-time nomination fee to enter the program. Entry fees in the Young Hunter Division will be FREE for every show through November 2025.

Both championships to be held from October 8-October 12 during Fall Classic III.

All entries will be responsible to pay for stalls and admin fees.

Eligibility: Available to all 5, 6, and 7-year-old horses as verified with USEF.

Enrolled jumpers can compete in all WEC - Wilmington shows in all jumper classes, not restricted to amateur or junior riders. Horses competing in the Young Jumper Incentive Program are not eligible for the Welcome Prix or the Grand Prix. Horses that are competing in the Young Jumper program are not eligible to receive prize money.

If an enrolled horse chooses to compete instead in any classes that are not included in this program, (i.e. Junior, Amateur, Welcome and/or Grand Prix) all normal fees will be charged. It is your responsibility to be sure the proper adjustments have been made to your invoice before checking out, as always statements are final at the conclusion of the show on Sunday evening.

Horses will be listed in results and receive ribbons and awards but will not receive prize money.

Jumper Nomination Fees: \$650 if completed by April 1, 2025

\$800 if done prior to the closing date of the championship \$1000 if done AFTER the closing date of the championship

**Hunter Nomination Fee:** \$250 - competing once in the division will automatically be converted to a nomination fee for all future shows.

Any discrepancies or unforeseen conflicts within the rules will be decided by WEC show management, whose decision will be final.

\*The purpose of this program is to promote the safe and ethical training and development of young horses in the country; therefore, jumpers will be limited to seven classes per week under the program.\*

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Soort Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org. as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

#### **HUNTER DIVISIONS**

The rated sections of this competition are official USEF point competitions for USEF National and USEF Zone Horse of the Year Awards Programs. All hunter classes to be judged on performance and soundness. All Hunter classes requiring a jog will trot a circle at the end of their round on a loose rein format.

**Hunter Courses:** Courses will consist of at least eight fences with changes of direction. Fences will simulate obstacles found in the hunt field, such as brush, post and rails, walls, in and outs, gates, etc. No bank or water jumps. Course diagrams will be posted no later than 30 minutes before the class. In some cases, the area of the courtesy circle may be restricted by a dotted line. Under Saddle classes to be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. No martingales permitted. In High Performance, A/O and Junior classes, entries may be asked to hand gallop collectively one way of the ring, at the Judge's discretion. No more than eight shall be asked to hand gallop at one time. Minimum entry requirements: Management reserves the right to combine Sections with less than six entries. No split Section will be held with less than 3 entries. Handy Hunter Courses and jumps to simulate those found in trappy hunt country, and may include natural obstacles, a trot fence and a fence to lead over.

In accordance with this procedure, any appeal against a decision rendered by the FEI or its official bodies is to be settled exclusively by the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) in Lausanne, Switzerland.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE: The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise. VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS: These will be carried out in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations, Art. 1011 & the discipline rules, "General Regulations," 23rd Edition, Revision effective 20th April 2014, will apply: In accordance with Art.139.1. Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country (see GR 141.2), and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries must have a valid official FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership. In accordance with Art. 139.2. Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin, all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, (Vet Regs. ANNEX VII): All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between one and three months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding seven days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables. The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES, (VET. REGS, CHAP. V & VI AND ANNEX IV): Regular sampling is carried out in CCIs (3\*, 4\*), CSIs (3\*, 4\*, 5\*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. The number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate, however a minimum of three is recommended (Art. VR 1016). Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Group I & II only).

INSURANCE: All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

Refer to the Official FEI Definite Schedule for all details and class specifications. Amateur riders make sure to check current USEF rules regarding competing in International and National events.

Jumper Nomination Fee: All jumpers must pay a nomination fee except Low, Medium and High Schooling, Young Jumpers, 1.20m, and Low Children's Adult Jumper section. Children's Adult Jumper/Modified Child Adult \$85, all others \$200. This fee is in addition to the declaration (entry fee).

Jumper Specs: Please see schedule for tables. In order to compete in any Jumper classes at recognized competitions as an exhibitor, rider, trainer, or his/her agent(s), a person must be a member of the USEF and USHJA or pay a showpass fee.

Attire: Proper attire required in all Classics, Futures Prix and Welcome. Formal attire required in Grand Prix.

Horse Recording: All horses competing in this competition must possess an USHJA Horse Registration - \$75.00 for life. Any change of horse's name and/or ownership must be recorded with Federation. Horses competing for \$25,000 or higher classes must be RECORDED with USEF.

Poling: Manual Poling is not permitted.

Order of Go: In classes offering prize money and where management deems necessary all horses names and positions will be drawn by the computer and in cases with riders on multiple mounts the computer will adjust the order, if necessary, to a minimum of 8 horses between rides (where possible).

Ties: All ties for first place will be jumped off, ties for other than first place will remain tied, and prize money will be split equally. (for exceptions see JP145.3)

Declarations: All horses must be declared (entered) in classes in which they intend to show by 5:00 P.M. the day previous to the class to ensure entry to the class.

Championships: Championships will be offered in all divisions that hold 3 classes with 3 or more entries, except Table II classes. Points used will be 10-6-4-2-1-1/2, except the bonus class which will be 15, 9, 6, 3, 2, 1. Bonus class breaks ties. Bonus class is always the last class of the section.

Prize Money: Unless otherwise specified prize money will be paid out - 1st-25% / 2nd-19% / 3rd-15% / 4th-10% / 5th-9% / 6th-8% 7th- 7% 8th 7% except classes paying \$1200 or less will be paid out 1st-30% / 2nd-22% / 3rd-15% / 4th-12% / 5th-11% / 6th-10%

At all heights to qualify as a spread fence, the fence must be 5cm (2") up to 15cm (6") wider.


