Campground: To reserve a campsite, you must add it to your entry or stall reservation online. Campsites are offered at \$90 per show for full water, sewer, and electric. Campers may arrive Wednesday and must depart by **7am Monday**.

Check-In and Check Out: No numbers may be released until a form of payment is submitted and all signatures are in order. Please ensure that you sign online before submitting your entries. All accounts must be settled in full within 30 minutes of the conclusion of the show or a \$50 late check out fee will be added, per late day, to each entry. We accept all cards with a 3% convenience fee.

Stall Reservations: Stalls must be ordered using your horseshowing.com account. Stalls are priced at \$85 per week per stall and **must be secured with your reservation with payment in full, open check or credit card**. The cancelation deadline is the Thursday night at midnight, 14 days before the start of the competition. Stalls must be cancelled in writing to stalls@wec.net, after that stalls will not be refunded for any reason and if not prepaid, the credit card or open check on file will be executed. Stalls are not available on entries, however you can pay the \$85 ENTRY DEPOSIT online at time of entry submission in lieu of sending an open check. Stalls may be permanent in barns or temporary vinyl under permanent roofs.

Arrival: Horses may arrive on Wednesday at 3pm. Requests for early arrival can be made in writing to stabling management at stabling-management at <a

Aisles: Aisles must be kept clear, please purchase a tack stall to store tack trunks, hay, feed, Theraplates, etc. No Cross ties in aisles at any time. No loitering will be permitted in barn aisles. No tacking or grooming in aisles. No horses or dogs are permitted to be tied in the aisles. Dogs on leashes must not be able to access the aisle unless attached to a human as it is dangerous for horses and people passing by.

Feed Bedding: Order on HorseShowing.com as a group using the 4th menu item.

Adding Classes: Must be done through your horseshowing.com account or on a trainer report in the show office by 5pm the night before the class. Same day adds will likely be denied.

Scratching Classes: Should be done through your horseshowing.com account as it will immediately remove the class from your bill AND immediately send a message to the starter and the announcer that you are scratched. **If you only tell the gate that you are scratching, the fee WILL NOT come off your bill**, they do not have ability to scratch you from a class. Scratches must be done before the completion of the class.

ADMINISTRATIVE AND FACILITY FEE: An administrative fee of \$81 will be added to each entry; this fee covers things such as the office, online entries, schooling, and the EMTs.

COGGINS AND HEALTH CERTIFICATES: Proof of negative Coggins, dated within the last 12 months and vaccinations (Flu/Rhino) within 6 months are required for property access.

SCHOOLING – Open schooling is available in all show rings on Thursday and each evening until 7:30pm, time and weather permitting. If showing concludes after 6:30pm, schooling in the show rings will be permitted for one hour following the completion of the course build.

MANAGEMENT AND CONDITIONS

Management reserves the right to cancel or combine classes if warranted by insufficient entries warrant. Management also reserves the right to refuse any entry or move classes as deemed fit.

Arena Horse Shows, World Equestrian Center, organizers, officials, volunteers and workers of the Summer Series Schooling Shows will not be held responsible for accidents, thefts or injuries to rider, horse, guest, spectator, groom or equipment at the show. This will be a condition of entry to the showgrounds.

PARTICIPATING RIDER CODE OF CONDUCT – Arena Horse Shows expects appropriate behavior from all riders, trainers, spectators and others participating in any WEC-sanctioned or supported event. Inappropriate behavior may include, but is not limited to: possession, use or distribution of any illegal drugs; profanity, vulgar language or gestures; harassment (i.e., using words or actions that intimidate, threaten or persecute others before, during or following WEC activities); failure to follow rules; and abusing a horse. Reports of inappropriate code of conduct may be made at any time to the Show Manager via email, text, phone call or in-person. Any verbal or physical act of discourtesy toward a judge, show official, show staff or Arena staff member on the part of a trainer, owner, rider, handler, groom, family member or person associated with an entry is a violation of the Code of Conduct. Persons found by show management to be in violation of this Code of Conduct will be unable to participate in the remainder of the show and will forfeit all fees and awards from previous classes and divisions.

RIBBONS AND AWARDS

Eight ribbons will be offered in each class. Champion and reserve champion will be offered in each division. Riders earning the championship of their division will be allowed to choose one award from the "Champion Store" located in the vet building behind the outdoor main hunter ring. Prize money will be applied to your final invoice provided you have a W9 on file. Any credit will be transferred to your next show or sent by mail within 30 days of the conclusion of the show.

POLING

Manual poling and use of bamboo offsets are prohibited at all times on the grounds of World Equestrian Center. In the event of a violation of this regulation, the involved horse and its trainer of record as indicated on the entry form will be suspended from further competition.

JUMP ORDER

A random jump order may be established, at the manager's discretion, for all jumping classes. Riders who anticipate a conflict must arrange their order of go with the gate person as soon as a possible conflict is known. In lieu of a posted order, it is the responsibility of the trainer and rider to construct a plan with each ingate.

RINGS – We will be using the outdoor rings.

HUNTERS

Courses will simulate fences found in the hunting field such as brush, stone walls, in-and-outs, oxers, post-and-rails, gates, aikens, and panels. In some classes, the area of the courtesy circle may be restricted in the ring. This would be demonstrated using a dotted line. All classes are to be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise specified. Championships will be given in all divisions with three or more entries.

In all under-saddle classes, horses will be shown – both directions – at the walk, trot, and canter. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Martingales are not permitted.

PLEASE NOTE

- Braiding is not required and should be discouraged
- Under saddles and flat classes will not be held up for trainer conflicts. It is the riders' responsibility to be at the ring when the class is opened. Management and staff are not responsible for missed flat or under saddle classes.

- Horses competing in classes in which they were not previously entered will be required to pay a double entry fee for those classes.
- A processing fee of \$50 plus collection fees will be made for any nonnegotiable checks.
- Non showing horses will be required to pay a fee of \$75 in addition to stabling charges and an administration fee regardless of the reason.
- There is no scratch fee if done online OR in the show office prior to the completion of the respective class, after that point, classes become nonrefundable. Show management recommends you enter all classes in which you might show then scratch what you decide not to do.

Air vests are allowed (and encouraged) in all disciplines. For Hunter and equitation classes, judges are instructed to not deduct points for the use of an air vest. Please understand the show will not be delayed in order to reset the air vest. Riders who choose to wear air vests are therefore strongly encouraged to have spare equipment (air canisters, tethers, and entire vest) ringside so that the vests that have been inflated can quickly be returned to operation. Air vests are permitted without a show coat ONLY if being worn with a color matched, long sleeve, collared shirt.

AMATEUR-OWNER HUNTER 3'3"

Open to horses ridden by an amateur owner or an amateur member of the owner's family, who is no longer eligible to compete as a Junior. An Amateur-Owner may compete one (1) different horse in the Adult Amateur division. To be judged on performance and soundness with an emphasis on manners. Fence height: 3'3". Individual class fee: \$25.

Class 51, 52, 53, 54: Amateur Owner Hunter 3'3"

Class 55: Amateur Owner Hunter Under Saddle

JUNIOR HUNTER 3'3"

Open to horses – over 14.2 hands high – and riders who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of that show year. Entries must be handled by Juniors in all phases. Horses shown in this section may cross-enter another section if eligible. A Junior may compete one (1) different horse in the Children's Hunter division. To be judged on performance and soundness with an emphasis on manners. Fence height: 3'3". Individual class fee: \$25.

LOW WORKING HUNTER

Open to all horses. Fence height: 3' Individual classes: \$25.

Open to horses of any age in their first or second year of showing over 3' fences. Fence height: 3' and 3'3".

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER

Open to Amateurs who are no longer eligible to compete as Juniors. Riders may not compete in any other classes at the same show where fences exceed 3'3".

Horses may not cross-enter the Amateur Owner Hunter at the same show. Riders may cross-enter the Amateur Owner Hunter on difference horses, given that they are only showing one (1) Adult Amateur horse. Fence height: 3'. Individual class fee: \$25.

Class 61, 62, 63, 64: Adult Amateur Hunter

Class 65: Adult Amateur Hunter Under Saddle

CHILDREN'S HUNTER

Open to horses and ponies ridden by a Junior. Neither horse nor rider may cross-enter into the Pony Hunter at the same show. Riders may cross-enter the Junior Hunter on different horses, given that they are only showing one (1) horse in the Children's Hunter.

Spreads not to exceed fence heights. Fence height: 3'. Individual class fee: \$25.

MODIFIED CHILDREN'S/ADULT HUNTER

Open to horses and ponies to be ridden by a Junior or Adult, rider may not cross enter above 3'.

Open to registered Thoroughbreds; horses will be required to show proof of breed registration. Fence height: 2'6" and 3'. Individual class fee: \$25.

BABY GREEN HUNTER

Open to all horses and ponies in their first or second year of showing that have not shown over fences higher than 2'9". Horses and ponies may not cross-enter classes where fences exceed 2'9". Fence height: 2'6". Individual class fee: \$25.

LOW ADULT HUNTER

Open to horses ridden by riders 18 years of age or older as of December 1st of that show year. Riders may not cross- enter into any classes where fences are 3' or higher at the same show.

CHILDREN'S PONY HUNTER

BEGINNER HORSE/PONY

Open to horses and ponies in their first or second year of showing that have never shown 2'6" or higher across all disciplines. Horses may cross-enter Baby Green Hunter only. Trotting will not be penalized. Fence height: 2'. Individual class fee: \$25.

BEGINNER RIDER

Open to riders in their first or second year of showing that have never shown 2'6" or higher across all disciplines. Trotting not penalized. Fence height: 2'. Individual class fee: \$25.

SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER

Open to riders 11 years of age and under as of December 1st of that show year. Riders may not cross-enter any other classes at this show with fences exceeding 2'3" across all disciplines. Fence height: 2'. Individual class fee: \$25.

LONG STIRRUP (LIMIT) HUNTER

Open to riders 12 years of age and over as of December 1st of that show year. Riders may not cross-enter any other classes at this show with fences exceeding 2'3" across all disciplines. Fence height: 2'. Individual class fee: \$25.

Hunter derbies are run using a two-round format with a classic and a handy round. Top 12 competitors from the first-round return in the handy in reverse order. Order of go is determined by a posted order. If a conflict is anticipated, please note that you may move up in the order but not down. Late or approved same day adds must go at the top of the class. Each derby will pin to 8th place and prize money will be awarded to the top 6 as outlined below. Top 3 are required to present in the ring to receive their prize money.

JUMPER DIVISIONS

Courses in the Jumper divisions may consist of any combination of the following: brush, gates, oxers, post and rails, liverpools, walls, panels, and coops. Horses that are tied for placings other than first will be placed according to their first-round time. A rotating jump order will be established as required. Jumper championships will be awarded to all divisions, with three or more entries, except where noted. The last class of each Jumper division will be the Bonus points class with points 15-9-6-3-2-1 All other classes are 10-6-4-2-1-.50

INTERMEDIATE CHILDREN'S/ADULT JUMPER

Horses ridden by a Junior or an Amateur. Intermediate horse / rider combinations may cross-enter Novice Children's / Adult Jumper. Fence height: .85 m (2'9") Individual class fee: \$25.

NOVICE JUMPER

Open to all Horses to be ridden by a Junior or Amateur. May cross-enter Low / Child Adult. Fence height: .95m (3'1"), spreads to .95m (3'1"). Individual class fee: \$25.

Class 212, 213, 214: Novice Jumper

LOW CHILD/ADULT JUMPER

Open to horses ridden by Junior or Amateur. Fence height: 1.00m (3'3"), spreads to .9m (2'11"). horse/rider combination may cross-enter Children's / Adult Jumper. Individual class fee: \$25.

Class 215, 216, 217: Low Child / Adult Jumper

FEATURED JUMPER CLASSES

Class 250: \$500 Gamblers Choice .95m

Class 251: \$500 Gamblers Choice 1.10m

The Gamblers Choice will be run with obstacles that have been allocated point values ranging from 20 to 120 depending on their set degree of difficulty. Each obstacle may be jumped twice – in either direction – the sequence of which is up to the discretion of the rider. Points will not be allocated for any fence that is knocked down and the rider will not be able to jump that fence again for the remainder of the round. Each rider will have 60 seconds to acquire the most points possible. Riders must be sure to break the timers as time is used as a tie breaker if scores are tied. At the end of each round, the rider will be given the option to jump the "Joker" fence worth 200 points. However, if the "Joker" is not jumped successfully, then the rider forfeits 200 points.
