HORSE SHOW RULES

Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current federation rule book and current FEI rules will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

This competition is recognized by both the USEF and EVUSA. EVUSA rules will apply for all USEF and EVUSA classes offered. Please review the current EVUSA & USEF rule books. Rule books available at www.usef.org and www.equestrianvaulting.org. EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF AND EVUSA RULE BOOKS WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGES IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH. Management reserves the right to correct any error or make any changes in the program or class list at its discretion. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the horse show management and its decision will be final.

2026 USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of competitions listed herein. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors, and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

If not currently a USEF Active Competing member or Subscriber, I acknowledge that I will be enrolled for no cost as a USEF Fan and my USEF Fan Account will continue to annually automatically renew in the USEF's sole discretion. Additionally, I acknowledge that the benefits of a USEF Fan are subject to change without notice. USEF may in its sole discretion, at any time, terminate my USEF Fan status. I acknowledge that I may opt out at any time by going to My USEF Dashboard or calling (859)810-8733.

HORSE SHOW RULES

STATEMENT AS TO FEDERATION FEE

(GR407.1-3) For every horse participating in any competition licensed by the Federation, a \$25 Federation Fee/Drugs & Med Horse Fee will be collected.

The Horse Show Management reserves the right in itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of an incident without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show management, their decision to be final.

The Horse Show Management reserves the right to limit entries, refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without claim for damages; to change any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings, or judges; to change specifications in jumper classes in order to facilitate the time schedule or as competition warrants, or to make any changes management deems is in the best interest of the show and its exhibitors.

Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show, its members, directors and employees, contractors, sponsoring entities and facility harmless for any loss or accident to horse, horses or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

USEF SAFE SPORT STATEMENT

All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All Participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

EVUSA SAFE SPORT REMINDER

All EVUSA adult members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All Participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, EVUSA Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. Competition management will not knowingly hire or contract or engage as a volunteer any individual who is on a Sex Offender Registry or has a criminal conviction involving child abuse/neglect, animal cruelty, felony drugs, sexual misconduct, or a violent crime, or anyone suspended, expelled, or banned by the suS Center for SafeSport, USEF, or FEI.

NECROPSY

I understand that any horse/pony "fatality" defined as a death by any means including euthanasia, at any time from when entries arrive at the Venue until departure from the Venue, or a death by any means including euthanasia at any time occurring as a result of any fatal injury or illness sustained during any WEC Event shall result in a necropsy. For any necropsy the Owner of the horse/pony shall perform a gross mortem examination, and the Owner hereby agrees to share all findings, results and medical reports with WEC. In the event an Owner does not perform a gross postmortem examination of the horse/pony, the Owner hereby authorized WEC to perform the gross postmortem examination at its sole cost and expense and agrees to share the results with Owner.

In the event an Owner's horse/pony dies from a disease that affects (an) other horse(s)/pony(ies) at the Venue the Owner of the deceased horse/pony agrees to indemnify any other third party Owner of a horse/pony affected and further agrees to indemnify and hold WEC harmless from any claim, demand, or liability arising out of or in any way related to the deceased horse/pony.

CONDITIONS

24 hour Security: 352.414.7960

Office Hours: The show office will be staffed on Friday, November 27th from 4pm-6pm. The office will be open from the start of competition until 15 minutes after the close of competition daily. A list of staff members and their positions will be posted. Please direct your questions to the appropriate person. The Scoring Office is off limits to ALL but assigned workers, management, and judges.

Entry Deadline: All entries must be submitted by 5pm EST October 20, 2026, via <https://horsesport.pro> (HSP) including digital submission of all waivers and payment. Each participant must complete the entry form including all numbers and signatures.

Check-In: Check-in will be Friday, November 27th between 4pm and 6pm. All paperwork must be completed and on file before check-in.

Checking In and Checking Out: All horses must leave a check or credit card on file. All accounts must be settled upon the conclusion of the final class on Sunday. Those that do not check out or leave an open check with the office will be charged a \$50 late check out fee for each day past Sunday.

Payment Method: Show Fees may be paid by cash, check drawn on an American bank, or any major credit card (3% fee).

Returned Checks/Declined Credit Cards/Credit Card Chargebacks: Checks returned by the bank, declined credit cards or chargebacks on credit card transactions for any reason are regarded as a serious offense and will be handled as follows: A 10% penalty will be assessed for every returned check or credit card chargeback (minimum of \$50). Accounts will be given ten days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be reported to USEF for collection/disciplinary action.

Refunds: The competition may refund entry fees, minus a \$25 processing fee, in the event of a cancellation. In the case of injury to a participant or a horse before the start of the competition, refunds will be provided (minus the processing fee) only if show management is notified of the scratch in writing before the competition starts, and appropriate medical documentation is provided.

Important USEF rules in effect: As of January 1, 2019, every USEF adult member (18 years of age or older) with a Competing Membership must complete USEF's Safe Sport Training. You will do this when logged into your USEF account, preferably when you renew your membership. Failure to complete the Safe Sport training will disqualify you from competing in any capacity until

it is completed. Junior riders that have reached their 18th birthday must complete Safe Sport training.

Arrival and Departure: FEI secure stabling is open November 26th, 3:00-7:00pm. USEF/EVUSA Only horses may arrive after 3pm on Friday, November 28th. All horses must depart by Sunday evening, November 30th. Early arrival and late departure must be arranged directly with the stabling manager. Early arrivals and late departures will incur an \$50 per stall/per day fee.

Stabling: The cost of stalls is \$200 for the show. All stalls (12'x12' and 12'x14') are permanent concrete stalls with doors, stable comfort mattress systems, and fans. Stalls may not be occupied by more than one horse at a time. To sublet stalls, you must notify the Stabling Office beforehand, as a sublet fee will apply. Failure to provide notification will result in being charged a stall fee.

A \$25 manure removal fee will be applied per stall. However, this fee will be waived if you purchase a minimum of three bags of shavings per stall from the WEC Ocala Feed and Bedding Store.

Horses are not allowed in locking tack rooms. A \$50 cleaning fee per stall and/or tack room will occur for any left behind personal belongings and trash. Shavings are to be purchased on-site. Any off-site shavings will result in an additional \$25 manure disposal fee per stall. A \$100 fee per stall and/or tack room will occur for any nails or screws in stalls/tack rooms. A \$50 charge for cardboard shavings.

No propane tanks, hot plates or space heaters are allowed in the stable area. No horses may be schooled over obstacles.

Medical Waste: Sharps must be placed in proper receptacles located in each barn. Failure to do this will result in a \$100 fine or other penalties deemed necessary by the Show Management. USEF GR1210.4: Competition Management may fine any individual including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

Feed and Bedding: must be ordered through <https://worldquestriancenter.jotform.com/form/223222771406146> at least 24 hours in advance to guarantee delivery prior to arrival. No outside shavings deliveries permitted.

CONDITIONS

Health Requirements:

1. 30-Day Statement of Health: A valid certificate of veterinary inspection is required for all out-of-state horses.
2. Negative Coggins: Required within 12 months of arrival.
3. Trainer/Owner Health Declaration: Signed confirmation that the horse has not shown signs of illness in the last 28 days; any infectious disease within the past six months must be disclosed.
4. At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below.
 - a. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.
 - b. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.
 - c. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine, and date of vaccine administration.
 - d. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.
 - e. Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee.

Horse Pre-Arrival & Bio-Security Measures: All horses entering WEC-Ocala premises must follow the strict Health and Safety Protocol found at this link: https://worldequestriancenter.com/wp-content/uploads/2023/12/Equine_HealthSafety2024-with-Trainer-Form.pdf. It is required that all riders document, in writing, their horses temperature for 72 hours prior to arrival at the show grounds. Do not ship horses with elevated temperatures. While on site for the duration of the event, a written temperature log, twice daily, is required. Temperature logs may be requested at any time by Competition Management or the Technical Delegate per USEF Rule Chapter 8, GR844. In case of an elevated temperature, please immediately inform management and the Veterinarian on call for the show. If the need arises, isolation stalls will be available. Every effort should be made to minimize stress and commingling of horses. It is always better to err on the side of safety.

Horse Check In: All horses may be checked for competed horse paperwork which includes health certificate (for out-of-state entries), negative coggins and vaccination records.

Mandatory Microchipping went into effect on December 1, 2018. You will not be allowed to compete with any horse that has not been microchipped. The microchip must be uploaded to your USEF account.

Welfare of the horse: The EVUSA & USEF requires all those involved in the sport of vaulting to adhere to the Code of Conduct for the welfare of the horse and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the Horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

Buddy Horses: All buddy horses must be in bridles with numbers affixed and handlers must be properly presented. Handlers may be in riding attire, lunging attire or other appropriate attire. No shorts, cutoffs or tank tops. Closed toe shoes required. The gate manager or judges may dismiss any buddy horses that are not properly presented, are disruptive or pose any danger and that horse will not be allowed in the arena as a buddy horse for the rest of the competition.

Barrels: Club camps and barrels will be allowed ONLY in designated areas. **NO BARRELS are allowed in the barns or the stalls.** If violated, a \$50 fee per offence will be incurred. Barrel practice must be supervised by club coaches at all times. No unsupervised barrel use is permitted. Only registered participants may use the barrels.

Medic/EMT: A "Qualified Medical Person" will be on-grounds during competition and warm-up schedule times.

CONDITIONS

USEF Membership: All vaulters, lungers, horses, horse owners, and coaches in USEF classes must be USEF members in good standing on the first day of competition, November 28th, 2026. To join or renew, go to: <https://www.usef.org/>

EVUSA: All vaulters, lungers, horses, horse owners, and coaches must be EVUSA members in good standing on the first day of competition, November 28th, 2026. To join or renew, go to: <https://inside.equestrianvaulting.org/>

EVUSA Non-Member Fees: Participants who choose to not become members by the close of entries, must pay the EVUSA non-member fee of \$25 and therefore be allowed to compete and earn ribbons. As a non-EVUSA member, scores earned will not count for end-of-year or Zone awards.

The following forms will be available in the Show Office: USEF Membership Form, USEF Competition Evaluation Form, USEF Competition Footing Evaluation Form, USEF Member's Confidential Evaluation of USEF Officials.

Order of Go will be posted on HorseSportPro. The draw for Order of Go for all classes will be performed by computer at 7pm EST on October 27th, 2026. Please review and email conflicts/changes to mlw555@gmail.com as soon as possible. All changes made on or after October 29th, 2026 will incur a \$25 per change fee; changes made on or after November 17th, 2026 will incur a \$50 per change fee.

Change Requests: ALL requests for changes to entries or the Order of Go after close of entries MUST be received by Show Management in writing. Before the competition, change requests must be made by email. At competition, changes should be made at the office.

Numbers: Individual vaulters and lungers must wear their EVUSA number in accordance with current EVUSA and USEF rules. Horses must wear their EVUSA number on their bridle. Team members must wear numbers per EVUSA rules. Paying Non-Members will be assigned a temporary number.

Medal Test: \$75 per test judging fee (apply to EVUSA Medal Test Secretary for medal test BEFORE the competition). \$50 for additional test. Testing will be allowing if time permits. Arrangements must be made with the event manager beforehand.

EVUSA Horse Award: To be eligible for yearly EVUSA horse awards starting in 2023, an additional fee of \$20/annual registration or \$85 lifetime registration must be paid to the EVUSA by the start of the competition.

Awards: Ribbons are awarded to all competitors in each class. Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons are awarded to division winners when there are at least four competitors. Additional ribbons may be awarded at management discretion. There are separate divisions for Men and Women in the Individual Trot, Copper, Bronze, Silver, 2* Young/Gold, and 3* levels. High Point scores will be submitted for qualified events.

Volunteers: When you register your club for the competition, you MUST provide a name, email, and cell phone number for a Volunteer Coordinator from your club. Until this information is provided, your club is not fully registered for the competition. Jobs will be posted after the Order of Go is released. An email will be sent to each club coordinator when jobs are posted. Every competing club is required to provide one volunteer slot per one vaulter. **NO EXCEPTIONS!** Clubs are not allowed to sign up for practice time at the competition until the required number of jobs for their club are filled. **We strongly recommend that each club bring enough ADULT non-vaulters to fill their requirements for job credits.** All jobs must be filled by 7pm EST November 17th, 2026. A \$30 fee will be enforced for each job that a club does not fulfill.

Practice Schedule: Sign-up with Competition Management for practice on Friday, November 27th for each registered horse in the competition arena. Clubs will not be allowed in the arena to practice until all volunteer requirements have been fulfilled.

Class List and Schedule: Classes may be canceled or added at show management discretion.

Warm Up: Only those competitors on-deck or warming up (as directed by gate steward) are allowed in the warm-up arena and on-deck arenas. There will be designated riding warm-up times. All riders must wear an approved helmet that meets the requirements of USEF GR801 when mounted.

Gate Times will be adhered to, with the exception of medical emergencies. Competitors are responsible for being at the appropriate gate at least 10 minutes before the assigned time. Keep an eye on the competition as classes may be running early. Any competitor not ready to enter the competition arena at the assigned time may be eliminated from the class.

Assisted Mounts: Please note in class rules which classes are allowed/required assisted mounts. ALL TROT and WALK classes require an assisted mount. Trot Barrel does not require a boost.

CONDITIONS

Disqualification: Any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges, steward or officials by a coach, lunger, vaulter, parent, or club affiliate shall disqualify those individuals from further competition and the individual and/or club shall forfeit their entire entry and related fees. Inhumane treatment of a horse on the grounds is forbidden and will result in disqualification of the offender(s) from competition. Judges have the right to dismiss from competition any horses which is uneven, unlevel, in bad condition, which shows signs of discomfort or fatigue, or which endangers the safety of participants. Failure to be on time to classes will result in disqualification, except in case of a conflict of schedule which has been approved by show management.

Dogs - Leash Law: Dogs and other pets must be on a leash at all times while on the show grounds. Fines for dogs found without a leash will result in a \$100 fine. No dog pens are allowed outside of the barns or in shared aisles. No dogs in stalls overnight.

Motorized Vehicles: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competition. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hoverboards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities

are exempt from this rule.

Horse Trailers: Parking is available in designated areas only. No trailers are permitted around the barns or outside barn aisles. This is allowed for unloading and loading only. No exceptions! WEC has strict fire laws.

Parking Violations: Fines of up to \$100 may be assessed, and vehicles may be booted. All fines can be paid at the Horse Show Office.

Food is available for purchase on site.

Emergency Information: All Horses must have an emergency information card attached to their stall.

Arenas & Footing: Competition is planned for outdoors, with an indoor as rain/weather backup and warm-up. The Stadium outdoor arena is 390' x 390' with stadium seating along 2 sides. The Stadium warm-up arena is 100' x 200'. In case of rain, Indoor Arena 3 will be used and is 170' x 530'. For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

WARNING:

Under Florida law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities.

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any USEF Event.

D. 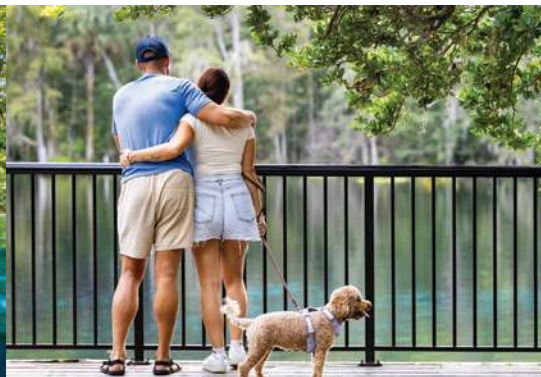

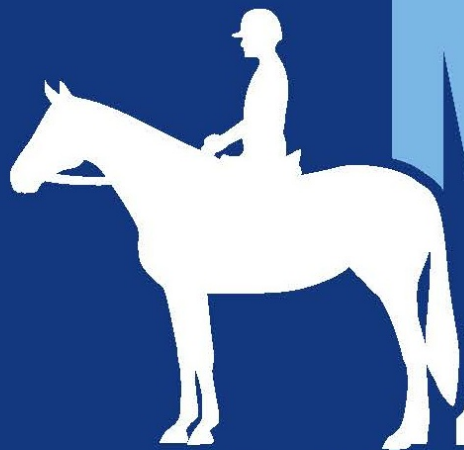

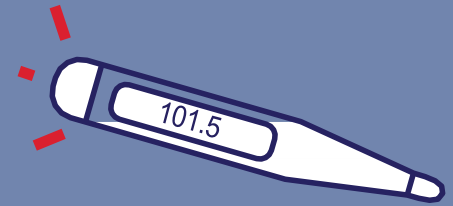
